and/or evaluation is required, this must be done by an RN in person because it is beyond the scope of practice for an LPN or LNA.

“School Activities” are field trips, school sports events and other such gatherings that are planned for students.

Medication Administration is detailed in the [Ed 311.02 Medication During School Day Advisory](#).

When an RN or LPN is not available to a school, at least one other person who has a current first aid and CPR certification shall be available. In order to ensure that one trained person is indeed available to students during school hours and during scheduled school activities, it may necessitate training a variety of personnel. Being available means they must be on school grounds during school hours or present at scheduled school activities so that they can provide emergency care immediately.

While CPR and first aid are part of an RN and LPN scope of practice, required skills in these certifications may change over time, so RNs and LPNs may decide to take refresher courses regularly or intermittently as needed in order to be able to perform competent emergency care or to adapt to the specific needs of students and teachers in their setting. CPR and first aid is not generally part of the educational preparation of an LNA so they would be required to take both CPR and first aid certification before being designated to be the primary person in the school setting to perform emergency care.
